A student of the of Public Law from the Protestant University of Congo and a graduate of Cardinal Lalula University, Mrs. Masudi has received addition training at the Canadian Foundation of Human Rights and the Center for Applied Studies for International Negotiations in Geneva. A Member of Parliament, General Secretary and political figure of MLC (Mouvement de Libération du Congo – the Movement for the Liberation of the Congo).

Masudi is an experienced and accomplished public servant reknown for her combats for democracy and high ethics. Long experienced in the promotion of human rights with a specific concentration on laws impacting women, she is President of the Congolese Women’s Election League (LIFCE) that gathers women from various political and independent parties together.

In 2005 she was proposed among 1,000 women for the Nobel Prize for Peace. As a legislator she initiated the draft for the protection and promotion of the rights of people with disabilities in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. She also facilitated the review and adoption of several legislative projects that include laws detailing rules for the implementation of women’s rights and gender quality. She has received numerous awards including the Excellence Award and Trophy for Best Politician of 2014 in her homeland, as well as, being merited by the Knights of the Order of the Franco-phone and Dialog of Cultures, by the Parliamentary Assembly of Francophone countries.
